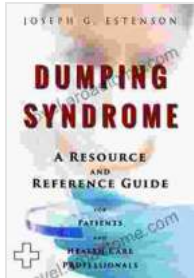

Pathophysiology

Occurs when the **stomach empties too quickly into the duodenum** (small intestine) after eating. This **BUMPING** causes a **massive fluid shift** leading to severe pain, low blood pressure, & nausea/vomiting **30 minutes after eating**. Commonly seen after **any type of bariatric surgery** like a **gastric bypass or gastrectomy** (removal of the stomach), typically done for our **obese clients** who are morbidly obese.

Signs & Symptoms

PRIORITY ACTION

- Report to HCP / Surgeon
- **Hypotension & tachycardia**
- **Diarrhea**, **dizziness**, **abdominal pain**, **N&V**
- **30 minutes AFTER eating**

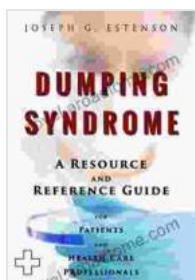

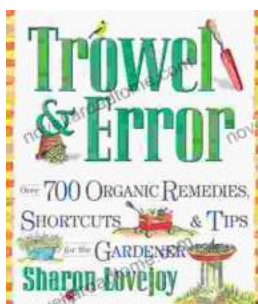
